

I have some very exciting news from David Hickey that I couldn't wait to share!

David wrote:

"Although last month the U.S. Supreme Court declined to take up the *Thomas v. Bright* case, there is still strong interest in this issue and others coming from the 2015 *Reed v. Town of Gilbert* decision from government officials. This afternoon, over 300 planners and city attorneys attended ISA's webinar on *Reed 5 Years Later: Sign Code Changes You Still*Need to Make, where four speakers covered issues involving the on/off premise distinction, temporary signs, campaign signs, murals and other sign code issues that are affecting communities and our industry across the country. The webinar lasted 90 minutes (and was eligible for 1.5 CM and 2 CLE credits), but could have went on for another hour, at least. And while the massive attendance was rewarding, it also helps that ISA made a small chunk of change in charging for attendance.

Kudos to James Carpentier for getting the four speakers and organizing the content. We plan on offering and charging for 3-4 more webinars to planners during the remainder of 2020, on issues including EMCs, creative sign design, historic signs and others. In addition, our proposal for the first ever APA Cross-Chapter Collaborative, representing the Texas, Arkansas, Kansas, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Louisiana APA chapters, on **Signs of Disaster: The Role of Visual Communications Pre, During and After Natural Disasters**, was recently accepted and will take place on October 7th. We hope to reach another couple hundred planners from those states on this extremely timely issue.

Back to recent legal developments – the 5th Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals, which has jurisdiction over Texas, Louisiana and Mississippi, just released another decision which finds the on/off distinction to be content-based and in violation of the First Amendment. SCOTUS may take up this issue yet!

SIGN RESEARCH FOUNDATION NAMED ONE OF '100 ASSOCIATIONS THAT WILL SAVE THE WORLD'

Washington, DC, August 17, 2020 – The American Society of Association Executives has named the <u>Sign</u> Research Foundation (SRF) to its list of "100 Associations that Will Save the World." SRF was honored in the "community engagement" category for its work with the *Urban Wayfinding Planning and Implementation Manual*. The manual brought together three often-contentious groups: city planners, designers and sign manufacturers.

The manual, first published in 2013, has been updated for 2020 with even more guidance and case studies. A series of webinars related to the manual have had triple-digit attendance.

"City planners are using the SRF-produced guidance to help their communities plan, fund, design and implement wayfinding projects," said Sapna Budev, SRF's executive director.

A collaborative relationship has emerged between planners, designers and sign manufacturers as a result of participating in the manual development.

"Wayfinding projects are some of the most complex signage systems in the world. The *Urban Wayfinding Planning and Implementation Manual* has provided clarity for all stakeholders looking to create an effective, durable, and well-designed system. Successful urban wayfinding projects encourage health, safety, and increased tourism dollars – positively impacting communities," Budev said. "We're thrilled that this work has been recognized by ASAE as part of its centennial celebration."

Urban Wayfinding offers insight into funding mechanisms for communities as well as new technologies in use. The manual is available at the Sign Research Foundation website, www.signresearch.org/urbanwayfinding, for \$29.99.

"Worst is Behind Us": Economic Report Q2 2020

The outlook for 2020 continues to decline, despite a sharp rebound in the economy earlier this summer, according to the Sign Industry Quarterly Economic Report for the second quarter. The report shows that the recession was short-lived and will have less of an impact on 2021 than expected. Still, IHS Markit puts a 20 percent probability on a second wave of COVID-19, which is not factored into a potential recovery.

The report covers the second quarter of 2020 and was prepared in June. It is sponsored by the National Association of Sign Supply Distributors (NASSD). The report assesses four segments of the industry: two supplier markets (printing and electrical /digital signage) and two end markets (electric/digital signage and architectural signage). It also forecasts commodities.
